The eligible claims amount has been reduced to eliminate non-compensable items under the above Vehicle Code Section such as a prior lien on a newly purchased vehicle, Gap Insurance, Warranty, Magna-Shield, Sales Tax, Vehicle Service Contracts, DMV fees such as California Tire Fees, Smog Abatement/Transfer Fees, attorneys fees, pain and suffering, and/or to reflect the disputed amount rather than the purchase price of the subject vehicle.

Note: The CMVRC received 54 deficient claims, as defined by *California Vehicle Code Section 12204(b)(1)(A-F)*. When a claim is deficient, correspondence is promptly sent to the claimant listing the deficiency(ies) and stating how the deficiency(ies) can be cured, such as supplying supporting documentation. The claimant is also notified that the claim will be re-opened as soon as the claimant corrects the deficiency(ies). These 54 claimants did not cure their deficiencies.
